* At 309 PM PST, A combination of local law enforcement and media has reported numerous areas with flooded roadways across . Eastern WA and Northern Idaho. Plugged culverts are diverting streams on to roads and in some the main cause however steep terrain cases, washing out roads. Delayed runoff and continued threat for rain and snow melt through tonight will keep the threat for flooding through Friday morning and the warning has been extended.

There have been several reports of damaged roads from flooding today. Use caution if you come across a flooded road. Do not drive through the flood waters unless you are certain it is safe and passable. If you are not sure...contact your local law enforcement.

Additional rainfall amounts near a quarter of an inch will be possible by Friday morning with locally up to half an inch. The bulk of the precipitation will fall across southeastern WA and North Idaho this evening and tonight. Drier weather returns Friday.
