

**Minutes of Meeting
Juvenile Probation
March 1, 2019
10:00 a.m.**

The Kootenai County Board of Commissioners: Chairman Chris Fillios, Commissioner Leslie Duncan and Commissioner Bill Brooks met to discuss the following agenda items. Also present were Juvenile Probation Director Debra Nadeau and Deputy Clerk Tina Ginorio. Also present was Idaho Department of Juvenile Corrections District 1 & 2 Liaison Zlata Myr.

- A. Call to Order:** Chairman Chris Fillios called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.
- B. Changes to the Agenda (Action):** There were no changes to the agenda.
- C. Business:**

Kootenai County 2018 Annual Juvenile Justice Report (Discussion)

Juvenile Probation Director Debra Nadeau introduced Idaho Department of Juvenile Corrections District 1 & 2 Liaison Zlata Myr. She said Ms. Myr had worked in the Kootenai County Juvenile Detention Center and the Kootenai County Juvenile Probation Department for a number of years before taking her current position about six months ago.

Ms. Myr reviewed the 2018 Annual Juvenile Justice Report for Kootenai County Court Services. She pointed out that the ISB (Incident Based Reporting) numbers included in the report were from 2017; she said those statistics were always a year behind, but the rest of the information was from 2018. She noted that, of the five hundred seventeen juvenile petitions filed in 2018, 71% were for misdemeanors, 15% for felonies and 14% were status offenses. Ms. Myr said there were nine hundred seventy-four intakes into the Kootenai County Juvenile Justice System, including both probation and diversion, and eight hundred and three releases. She also drew attention to the figures on community service hours performed, restitution collected for victims, number of juveniles who successfully completed probation and the recidivism rates.

Chairman Fillios inquired what portion of the County's Juvenile Justice System the County funded. Ms. Myr said about half of her staff are paid through the Juvenile Corrections Act and the Tobacco Tax; the County paid for the other half of the A Budget. She stated B Budget was split between Tobacco Tax, the County and the Lottery Fund.

District 1 2018 Annual Juvenile Justice Report (Discussion)

Ms. Myr reviewed the statistics for all of District 1: seven hundred thirty-three juvenile petitions filed, with 73% misdemeanors, 15% felonies and 12% status offenses. She said there were one thousand one hundred forty-five intakes and one thousand and seven releases from the juvenile justice system in 2018. She also reviewed demographics for

age, gender, race and ethnicity of offenders, as well as community service hours performed, restitution collected for victims and recidivism.

Idaho Department of Juvenile Corrections Legislative Update (Discussion)

Ms. Myr provided the Commissioners with copies of the Legislative Update for 2019.

- D. Public Comment (Discussion):** This section is reserved for citizens wishing to address the Board regarding a County-related issue. Idaho Law prohibits Board action on items brought under this section except in an emergency circumstance. Comments related to future public hearings should be held for that public hearing. There was no public comment.
- E. Adjournment (Action):** Chairman Fillios adjourned the meeting at 10:26 a.m.
