



Yellow Devil Hawkweed

BOTANICAL NAME: *Hieracium Glomeratum*

WHAT DOES IT LOOK LIKE?

Yellow Devil Hawkweed is a perennial wildflower that grows up to 2 feet tall with leafless stems. Flowering stalks develop from rosettes with short, stiff haired leaves that grow up to 7 inches long. Yellow, ray flowers resemble dandelions. Flower heads are often held in umbels. Yellow Devil Hawkweed lacks stolons and rhizomes.



WHERE DOES IT GROW?

It tends to inhabit roadsides, pastures, meadows, forest clearings, and disturbed areas.

HOW DOES IT SPREAD?

It reproduces by seed which can be easily carried by wind, allowing for long distance dispersal.

WHY IS IT A NOXIOUS WEED?

It displaces desirable grasses pasture plants leading to loss of available forage.



HOW DO I CONTROL IT?

Yellow Devil Hawkweed is on the Idaho's EDRR list, which is the highest priority of State Noxious Weeds. If you find it, please report it to the Kootenai County Noxious Weed Control Office as soon as possible so we can positively identify it, map its location, and help you eradicate it.
