

Resolution 2019-95
Surplus Vehicle/Asset Removal/Juvenile Detention

WHEREAS, *Idaho Code* §31-808 vests the Board of County Commissioners with the power and authority to manage real and personal property for the benefit of the County; and,

WHEREAS, *Idaho Code* §31-829 provides that whenever any elected official has any personal property belonging to the county under his/her jurisdiction or control which, in his/her judgment, is of no further use to the county, he/she may, with the consent of the Board of County Commissioners, have the property declared as surplus and dispose of the property through sale or other means; and

WHEREAS, the Kootenai County Juvenile Detention Office has on its asset list one (1) 1998 Red Chevrolet Blazer, Asset Tag #3216, VIN # 1GNDDT13W5WK110836 which, due to age, repair and safety concerns are of no further use to the County; and

WHEREAS, the vehicle described hereinabove have a value in excess of \$250.00; and

WHEREAS, the sale of this vehicle would generate additional income for the County; and

WHEREAS, the Kootenai County Juvenile Detention Office desires to have the vehicle declared as surplus property, and as such to be disposed of by the County at public auction;


NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the vehicle described hereinabove be, and hereby is, declared to be surplus property, and in accordance therewith, said vehicle shall be sold at public auction to the highest bidder, after advertising the same as surplus property, in accordance with *Idaho Code* §31-808.

Upon a motion to adopt the text of the foregoing Resolution made by Commissioner Duncan, seconded by Commissioner Fillios, the following vote was recorded:


