

Resolution 2016-56
Fixed Asset Deletion/Buildings & Grounds

WHEREAS, *Idaho Code* §31-807 vests the Board of County Commissioners with the power and authority to manage real and personal property for the benefit of the County, and

WHEREAS, *Idaho Code* §31-829 provides that whenever any elected official has any personal property belonging to the county under his/her jurisdiction or control which, in his/her judgment, is of no further use to the county, he/she may, with the consent of the Board of County Commissioners, have the property declared as surplus and dispose of the property through sale or other means; and

WHEREAS, the Kootenai County Buildings & Grounds Department has on its asset list one (1) wall mount camera, Asset Tag #4317; one (1) military forklift, Asset Tag #2098 and one (1) desk in the auditor's department, Asset Tag #4064, which due to age are obsolete, lost and cannot be found after a diligent search and are therefore of no further use to the County; and

WHEREAS, the estimated present value of each item is less than \$250.00, being lost and essentially valueless; and

WHEREAS, Kootenai County Buildings & Grounds desires to have above referenced items removed from the County's asset list;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the items referenced hereinabove are valueless, obsolete and lost and shall be removed from the County's list of assets.

Upon a motion to adopt the text of the foregoing Resolution made by Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Commissioner Eberlein, the following vote was recorded:


