

Resolution 2015-67
Surplus Vehicle/Clerk of the District Court/Bailiffs

WHEREAS, *Idaho Code* §31-807 vests the Board of County Commissioners with the power and authority to manage real and personal property for the benefit of the County; and,

WHEREAS, *Idaho Code* §31-829 provides that whenever any elected official has any personal property belonging to the county under his/her jurisdiction or control which, in his/her judgment, is of no further use to the county, he/she may, with the consent of the Board of County Commissioners, have the property declared as surplus and dispose of the property through sale or other means; and

WHEREAS, the Kootenai County Clerk of the District Court/Bailiff's Office is in possession of a 1991 Chevy Blazer, VIN 1GNDT13Z9M2323263; and,

WHEREAS, the vehicle is in poor shape due to its age, and it would not be cost effective for Kootenai County to maintain the vehicle; and,

WHEREAS, the vehicle has a value in excess of \$250.00; and

WHEREAS, the sale of the vehicle would generate additional income for the County; and

WHEREAS, the Kootenai County Clerk of the District Court/Bailiff's Office desires to have the vehicle declared as surplus property, and as such to be disposed of by the County at public auction.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the vehicle described hereinabove be, and hereby is, declared to be surplus property, and in accordance therewith, said vehicle shall be sold at public auction to the highest bidder, after advertising the same as surplus property, in accordance with *Idaho Code* §31-808.
